

# Corporate dictatorship belies the myth of "U.S. democracy"

Q: If corporate U.S. hawks entered all these foreign wars by concocting shocks, as the song claims, how come we have not heard of such outrageous deceptions before?

A: Corporations control information by their control of the media, government, economy and academia. Corporate dictatorship is a four-legged beast that devours democracy by killing truth. ### **The four-legged corporate beast has a very large tail: self-censorship by its subjects**

Corporate censorship of the media and academia is often blatant, but more often invisible. Editors, writers, professors, publishers and department heads want to advance their careers, if not keep their jobs. They know where their bread is buttered and they "go along to get along." A few cases of retaliation against "loose cannons" are enough to scare everyone else in line

For example, the University of Maryland gets lots of money doing military research. Several Marxist professors were fired during the Vietnam War. Burtell Ollman, a socialist who was elected to head the Economics Department, was denied this job by the Governor, so he left Maryland. If teachers like Burtell were allowed a voice, perhaps the financial barons would not have taken the country to the edge of economic collapse. But tenure means nothing if one opposes corporate dictatorship.
